## What is the Treasury doing to address infrastructure procurement and ensure that qualified professionals are involved on procurement committees?

- Project Management Units (PMU) are appointed in Infrastructure Departments and municipalities,
- Technical and Transactional Advisors have been appointed including in Treasury,
- Procurement plans have been introduced and Departments are compliant,

## How is the Department of Finance working with the private sector to eliminate tender and other corruption and ensure on-time payments?

- Rotation of officials within supply chain management,
- All officials in supply chain management are subjected to security vetting by the State Security Agency,
- All members of the bid specification, evaluation and adjudication committees are subject to security vetting by the State Security Agency,
- All newly or to be appointed officials despite of rank or level before their appointments are confirmed they undergo security vetting by the State Security Agency,

## How is the Department of Finance working with the private sector to eliminate tender and other corruption and ensure on-time payments?

- All officials in supply chain management have signed the Code of Conduct,
- Disclosure forms are completed,
- Introduced a directory for restricted companies and mostly this comprises of Government officials,
- Regular workshops with officials involved in procurement emphasising the need to uphold to good ethics are held – however as well private sector should desist from creating uncomfortable conditions for officials including by giving bribes,

## How is the Department of Finance working with the private sector to eliminate tender and other corruption and ensure on-time payments?

- Those that are found are subjected to normal disciplinary processes and if found guilty some are even fired. Some are even subjected to criminal charges wherein if they are guilty they are prosecuted and sent to prison.
- We have as part of improving on efficiencies, ethics, knowledge and skills introduced a certificate programme in partnership with the University of Pretoria whereby our officials from departments, municipalities and public entities are trained on supply chain management,
